- Headache is the 4th most common complaint in the ED.
- Less than 1/3 of headache patients experience sustained pain relief after being discharged from the ED.
- Occipital nerve blocks (ONBs) are as safe as, if not safer than, current treatment options.
- Multiple RCTs have shown ONBs with lidocaine provide localized, rapid onset relief that can last for several weeks.
- ONBs offer a non-narcotic treatment option that, when administered correctly, have no systemic effects.
- Studies have shown that ONB can be an effective treatment for migraine, chronic daily headache, occipital neuralgia, cervicogenic headache, and cluster headache.
- OcciGuide localizes the pathway of the greater and lesser occipital nerves for a quick accurate injection.
